His Holiness also asks "On this World Day of Prayer for Vocations, let us join in prayer and ask the Lord to help us discover his plan of love for our lives, and to grant us the courage to walk in the path that, from the beginning, he has chosen for each of us."

An article titled "Christ is alive and Living in Our Young People" published by Development and Peace, Caritas Canada states, "Pope Francis recently released an Apostolic Exhortation entitled "Christ is Alive" with a focus on the role of young people in the mission of the Church. Rebeccca Rathbone, program coordinator in Rome for Caritas International believes "this Apostolic Exhortation is going to give a hand up to young people who are trying to participate in various aspects of the Church and who before maybe

weren't taken seriously, or were met with challenges because people wouldn't accept their contributions." Ms. Rathbone further states "This Exhortation of Pope Francis says that, "young people do have a place in the Church and should have a place in the decision-making aspects of the Church."
