These women continue to inspire me in every meeting and encounter.

What is Faith to you? Faith is defined as a deep trust, strong belief, and commitment to someone or something, often in the absence of complete proof. We, as Catholic women, walk together in trust and faith and we honor the vision of working for God and Canada.

One of the areas which requires action is human trafficking so we will be designing a prayer service that will pray for victims of human trafficking and to bring an increased awareness to all areas of Nova Scotia. The provincial council promotes Human Trafficking Awareness Day, February 22<sup>nd</sup>, with a prayer service to be developed by myself and Karen Craig, Social Justice Chair that can be used in NS Councils.

As we are planning our Winter meetings and action items let us remember to pray for the victims of human trafficking and also for each other as we strive to fulfill our mission.

This is an excerpt from a prayer written by Joyce Rupp called The Continuous Call to Conversion with respect to Ministry and Service:

"Mentor of my life, you invite me to follow you. You give me the courage to do so. It is risky to go in your way.
